



- 314 `Atiya b. al-Aswad, Kharijite caliph, fl. 71-76/690-696. Drachm. KRMAN + AN = *unlocated mint in Kirman* AH 75. 3.9 gm. *bism Allah wali al-amr* in second obverse quadrant. Walker 217, A-28. **RARE**. *Small dark corrosion spot 11-11:30 obverse edge* **Choice EF** 200.
- 315 al-Muhallab b. Abi Sufra, Governor of Fars, ca. AH 75-79/694-698. Drachm, BySH = *Bishapur* AH 76. 4.04 gm. *bism Allah* followed by square of four pellets in second obverse quadrant. A-31, Eshrag 144. *Old light scratches on bust's neck* **Choice VF / About EF** 100.
- 316 `Abd al-Malik b. Marwan, the Umayyad Caliph, AH 65-86/685-705. Drachm DA+Gh = *Jahrum* YE 60. 4.06 gm. Pellet triplets flank crescent and star at obverse 6:00. A-32. **RARE**. *Minor stain 3-4:30 obv. margin* **EF** 225.

- 317 `Abd al-Rahman b. Muhammad, known as *Ibn al-Ash'ath*, rebel against Governor al-Hajjaj, fl. AH 81-84/700-703. Drachm, SK = *Sakastan* AH 82. 4.02 gm. *bism Allah rabbi* in second and third obverse quadrants. A-38A. **EXTREMELY RARE**. *Very minor staining in margin* **EF** 1,000.

- 318 In the time of al-Walid I, AH 86-96/705-715. Dirham, *al-Taymara* AH 91. A-128. *Near full flan* **VF** 35.
- 319 Dirham, *al-Taymara* AH 91. Another as above. *Some deposits and some crimping* **VF** 25.
- 320 Dirham, *Darabjerd* AH 92 **Good VF** 30.

- 336 **al-Mansur, AH 136-158/754-775.** Dirham, *Junday Sabur* AH 138. **RARE.** Toned over light deposits. Thin test slash typical of Northern European and Russian coin finds. Rather scruffy **VF** 100.
- 337 **Al-Mahdi, AH 158-169/775-785.** Dirham, *madinat al-Jayy* AH 162. Six pellets in annulets in obverse margin. *Yahye* cited below. Diagonal clipping left side **EF** 20.
- 338 Dirhams (2), *madinat Jayy* AH 162. Citing *Yahye* below. Two varieties. Six annulets with pellets around obverse margin, nothing above central legend on reverse; Five annulets with pellets around obverse margin, crescent above reverse central legend. Teisenhausen 922. *The first with thin test slash obverse edge. The latter with light deposits in peripheries* (Lot of 2) **Good VF - About EF** 50.
- 339 Dirham, *Ifriqiya* AH 165. **Scarce.** Once brush cleaned **VF** 75.



- 340 **al-Hadi, AH 169-170/785-786.** Dirham, *madinat al-Salaam* AH 169. *al-Hadi* named at end of protocol. *Ibr* above (for Ibrahim), *`ayn* below. Ties.1030, A-217. **RARE.** Raised line on obverse from slash or adhesion on die. Toned **EF** 150.
- 341 Dirham, *Ifriqiya* AH 170. Citing *al-Hadi* at top of protocol. A-217. **RARE.** Thin test slash on obverse center (consistent with Eastern European and Scandinavian finds) **Good VF** 85.
- 342 Dirham, *al-'Abbasiya* AH 170. Citing Governor *Yazid* below and *bey kha* (?) above. Anonymous type that could belong to either al-Hadi or Harun al-Rashid, but conventionally assigned to al-Hadi. Central striations typical to North African issues **VF** 35.
- 343 **Harun al-Rashid, AH 170-193/786-809 AD.** Dirham, *al-Muhammadiya* AH 172. Citing *Yahye* (b. Khalid al-Barmaki) above. Press mark upper edge **About EF** 45.
- 344 Dirham, *Tudgha* AH 177. Anonymous types. Six pellets in annulets around obverse / Crescent above central legend; the Prophetic mission (Qu'ran IX, 33) around. Cf.Eustache p. 297, note after 50: Fraehn 5d, cl.III C., p.12. **VERY RARE.** Single thin test slash on obverse **VF** 200.
This is actually an issue of a local North African ruler, but as it is anonymous it is classified under the Abbasids. Once an important mining town, Tudgha was some two days south of Sijilmasa. The latter, though, thoroughly eclipsed Tudgha, which is now lost in the sands of time.



- 345 Dirham, *al-Mubarak*a (in Tunisia) AH 179. Citing `Abbas. **VERY RARE**. Central crease and typical North African striations. Stain at edge and left reverse **VF** 125.
- 346 Dirham, *Ifriqiya* AH 180. Citing *Harthama* above, large annulet below. Ties.1283. **Very Scarce**. Small thin test slash reverse edge. Decent strike for issue **Good VF** 60.
- 347 Dirham, *al-Muhammadiya* AH 182. Citing *Ja`far* below, pellet triplet above. Ties.1317 **Good VF** 50.
- 348 Dirham *madinat Marv* AH 185. Citing *al-Amin Muhammad* as heir. `Ali above and `ayn yeh below. Two pellets below central obverse legend. A thin test slash on at the first coin's reverse edge **VF** 70.
- 349 Dirham *madinat Marv* AH 185. Citing *al-Amin Muhammad* as heir. `Ali above and `ayn yeh below, similar to previous lot, but pellet triplet below **Good VF** 90.



- 350 Dirham, *Dimashq* AH 189. Naming al-Ma`mun as heir to the caliphate. Lowick 602, A-219.10. **VERY RARE**. Thin test slash at obv. edge, two at reverse edge typical of Russian and Scandinavian coin finds. Small edge chip **EF** 125.
- 351 Dirham, *madinat Balkh* AH 190. Citing the Governor of Khurasan `Ali bin `Isa in the second line of the central legend just after the prophetic statement. Pellet above, letter `ayn below. Ties.1487. **RARE**. Single thin test slash reverse edge (typical of Eastern European and Scandinavian coin finds). Some weakness lower reverse **About EF** 150.
- The positioning of the governor's name on this coin, while not officially an infringement of the sikka, is most unusual. Titulature etiquette had yet to be formalized at this time. However, placing a governor's name in the central area before the position for the caliphal heir was essentially not an acceptable practice, although there are some rare occurrences of it.*
- 352 Dirham, *Ma`dan al-Shash* AH 190. Naming `Abdallah (al-Ma`mun) as heir, and citing `Ali and *Nadr*. Ties.1478-var. Tiesenhausen recorded variant without a dot on reverse **Choice EF** 75.
- 353 Donative Dirham, *al-Muhammadiya* AH 190. Anonymous types. Small neat calligraphy. Raised braided outer border with outer margin. **VERY RARE**. Accompanied by a normal strike for that year Lot of 2, both **EF** 500.
